

Hear Ye Hear Ye!

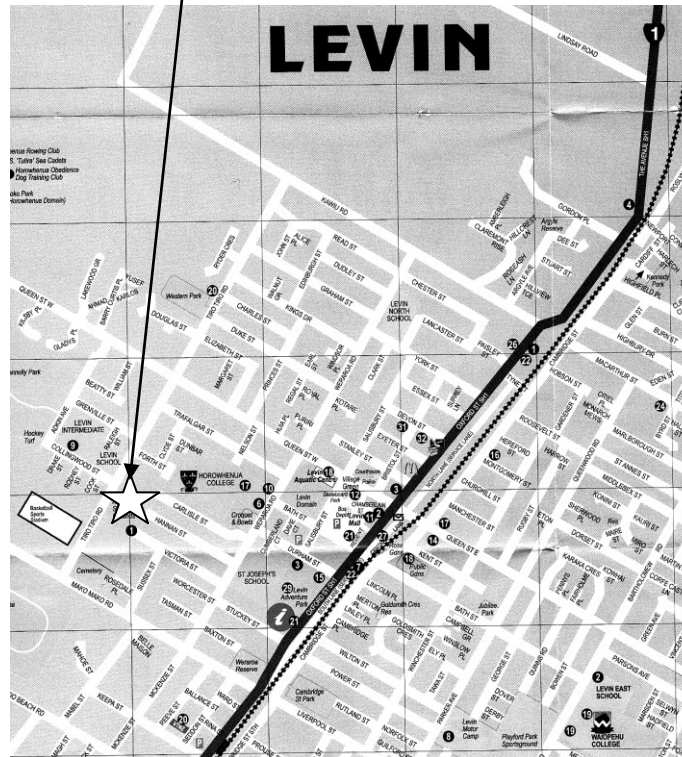

At Court this market day is our own Princess Horowhenua and her Trusty Chaperone to oversee the festivities.

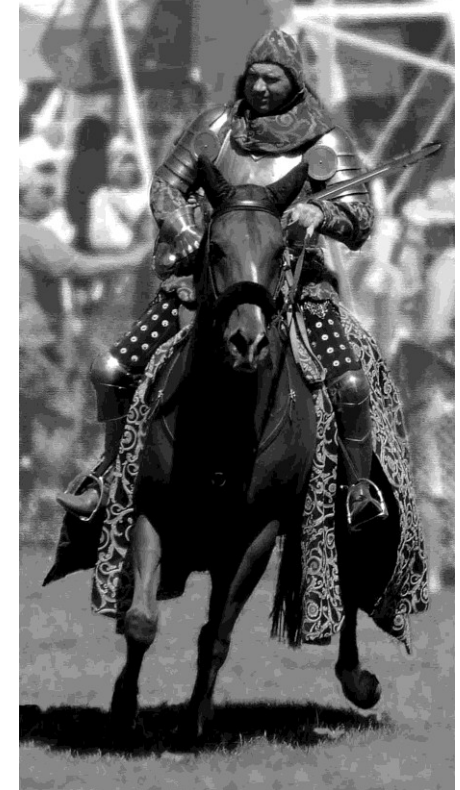
